

“Broken America”: The Dangerous Endgame of US-led Capitalism

ABSTRACT

The USA is a fragile oligarchy rotting from within. The profits of the leading capitalists are higher than ever—and the USA leads in mass poverty and disease, private and public debt and right wing politics. Industrial innovation and infrastructure are at an all-time low. The same applies, albeit not to such an extreme degree, to countries associated with the USA. These oligarchic regimes would continue in this vein including also genocidal practices if it weren't for the growing multi-polar self-organization of the much larger “rest” of mankind, such as BRICS: hence the arms build-up against Russia, China, and resistance in the Global South, with the threat of world war looming. So how can cooperation be deepened, including non-state cooperation, through democratic and anti-capitalist movements in civil society?

Due to its systemic decline, US-led capitalism is arming itself even further, accelerated by the younger, even more aggressive faction of capital represented politically by the current US president, Donald Trump. How, then, can the cooperation of the much larger “rest” of the world in terms of international law and human rights be deepened and expanded, including at the non-state level?

1. “Broken America” is to remain the sole world hegemonic power

The USA may be “a brittle gerontocracy rotting from within,” but this “broken America” is part of the “strange triumph” of this very state. This diagnosis is not discussed in the mainstream public sphere, but rather for internal self-understanding among the USA elites, here in *Foreign Affairs* (Beckley 2025). This is the magazine of the Council on Foreign Relations, the leading US foreign policy think tank, which was founded after World War I by the leading capitalists and has since accompanied the global expansion of what it claims to be the “only world hegemonic power.”

According to this diagnosis, 70 percent of Americans consider the USA to be “not good” or “poor,” with only 20 percent still having confidence in the government; patriotism, which is so important, has plummeted to a minority low. Multifaceted violence is on the rise, with two assassination attempts against current President Donald Trump during the election campaign. Economic wealth may go hand in hand with civic decline, but this “broken America” is nevertheless “the world’s only superpower.” And not only should it remain so, but it should be expanded and secured globally, with only a few corrections, according to numerous propositions in *Foreign Affairs*.

2. USA: oligarchic rule

Even Laurence Fink, the head of BlackRock, currently the largest and most influential USA capital organizer and the largest shareholder in US-led capitalism, admits: “Capitalism works, but it currently works for too few people.” Fink refers primarily to the USA, but also to friendly capitalist democracies. He sees it in the low pensions and accuses governments of not paying enough into the pension funds.¹

1) The systematic reduction of labor income

Fink downplays it as a temporary state of affairs and avoids mentioning those responsible for the accelerated decline in pensions for the working class over the past three decades: It is the leading corporations and their leading shareholder groups, with BlackRock at the forefront, that have further reduced labor income and thus pensions. However, it has been supported by governments since the 1980s, beginning under President Ronald Reagan.

As a result, the USA, supposedly the most economically successful country, has the lowest legal minimum wage among comparable capitalist countries. It stands at \$7.25 per hour and has remained unchanged for 16 years. Even the rhetorically union-friendly Obama administration did not raise the minimum wage. Adjusted for purchasing power, it is below the minimum wages in the EU-impooverished countries of Eastern Europe. Even when it is formally paid, it is often circumvented by paying the minimum wage for the contractual hours, but requiring additional hours to be worked for the work required, which are then not paid, such as when delivering the agreed number of parcels.

In addition, the minimum wage of USA can be reduced to \$2.13 for occupations in which tips are increasingly common, such as parcel and food delivery, catering, call centers, hotel room service, hairdressers, travel guides, and senior care workers, many of whom also work part-time, on temporary contracts, or seasonally. As a result, it is not

only traditionally black and Latino workers that have been and continue to be impoverished, but also white working-class.

2) Modernized slave labor I: in the US

And the minimum wage applies even less to the tens of millions of illegal immigrants who form a systemic pillar of the US economy as workers, consumers, and taxpayers, because income tax and local taxes are automatically deducted, even from illegal immigrants. Contributing to this level of normal illegality is the fact that since President Obama took office, the number of labor inspectors has been rapidly reduced.²

Several states have a higher minimum wage, such as California, which has a very high minimum wage of \$16.50. But this does not apply to millions of illegal workers in this state alone. For example, 75 percent of the 800,000 plantation workers are illegal. They toil in heat and cold without health protection for a few dollars a day.³ In addition to such farm workers, millions more illegal immigrants work also in other US states in construction and private households as temporary, part-time and casual workers without contracts, as cleaners, prostitutes, gardeners and carers for the elderly – as do, for example, the contract-free drivers of the largest taxi and transport service Uber and the gig workers in digitalize services.

That is why migrants are allowed to enter the USA permanently and in large numbers, despite the dangers, and at the same time are forced into slave-like, inhumane work under the threat of deportation. Illegality is a business model. Illegal immigrants remain invisible, live in fear, are often homeless, are not allowed to vote, receive no healthcare, and are often forced into petty crimes.

3) Modernized slave labor II: Global

After the abolition of slavery, the USA has constantly modernized forms of slave labor that violate human rights, and globalized them on an unequally larger scale in modernized neocolonialism, and continues to do so today.

This is done through their global supply chains by the automotive, pharmaceutical, food, agribusiness, and supermarket corporations, led by digital corporations such as Apple, Google, Facebook, Amazon and Microsoft. They have their expensive devices manufactured primarily in “Factory Asia” by specialist companies that employ low-wage workers in barracks, namely Foxconn, Pegatron, and Wistron from Taiwan. Because China has significantly increased wages over many years, Apple and its suppliers are fleeing to poor countries as quickly as possible. Apple alone has over 10,000 suppliers in dozens of poor countries – unknown to the public and the consumers. This is how young women between the ages of 18 and 25 assemble Apple iPhones in Chennai, India: Foxconn houses them in monitored mass accommodation, mostly without employment contracts. Their wages are 80 cents per hour, from which the costs of accommodation, cheap food, and daily transport to and from the factory are deducted. The majority of these young women, who are recruited from the poorest regions of poor countries

through employment agencies, will be sick after a few years and then replaced by new human resources.⁴

4) Modernized racism

For the new digitized jobs, such as content moderators in the field of self-driving car control, fruit picking and harvesting robots, and social media deletion work, US corporations are primarily expanding “Factory Africa”: Here, the new slave workers are exploited for two dollars a day – 150 crammed into a cramped, windowless room – in contract-free service for subcontractors in confusing supply chains (Muldoon, Graham, and Cant 2024. 17-41).

The modern-day slave labor is linked to a new form of racism that deliberately exploits Neo-colonial conditions in the USA itself and in friendly countries. For example, the world’s largest taxi and transportation service, Uber, specifically recruits its contract-free drivers from immigrant slums in major cities around the world: modernized racism (Sophie Bernard 2023).

The Middle Class Is Shrinking and Becoming Impoverished

For a long time, the middle class, numbering in the high tens of millions, was considered a guarantor of stability in US class society: working-class children could obtain higher education and move up the social ladder, becoming teachers, scientists, and engineers. Some of their children were able to climb even higher, becoming managers, bankers, professors, politicians, and journalists. They could buy their own homes or apartments, even two cars, and insure themselves against illness and old age.

But since the deregulation and privatization of the 1980s—promoted by the Republican Party (Reagan, Bush) and even more so by the Democratic Party (Clinton, Obama)—the middle class has also become impoverished in many ways: The costs of health care, childcare, school and university attendance, and rent have risen.

The majority of the middle class can no longer afford the status symbol of a condominium or a house of their own. Healthcare has become more expensive and is covered less and less by insurance. Tuition fees have risen, especially at private universities, which are crucial for social advancement: Graduates enter working life heavily in debt and have to take any job they can find. By around 2010, it was clear that the middle class was in a process of shrinkage and impoverishment (Arndt 2014).

5) The leading oligarchs, first class

These practices led to an explosion in self-enrichment among the ruling class. It renewed itself in part, primarily with the digital, automotive and food corporations and their wave of globalization, along with their new lenders and shareholders, the deregulated upstarts of private equity funds, hedge funds, and then, above all, with the premier league of BlackRock, Vanguard, State Street & Co.

Since the “financial crisis” at the latest, and with its help, they have become the leading ownership groups of several thousand of the most important US companies and banks – because BlackRock & Co. did not experience a financial crisis with their super-rich capital providers (Rügemer 2019, 24).

The Private Army of Transatlantic Capital

These oligarchs are supported by an army of specialized, highly paid service providers. These include corporate law firms, management consultants, auditors, PR agencies, rating agencies, and professors at private elite universities. They also take on government contracts, hold positions in the state, and then return to the private sector. Together, they form the “civilian private army of transatlantic capital” (Rügemer 2019, 228).

The oligarchs also control political opinion-making and mass culture. They own not only the traditional media for the academic and business audience, such as the New York Times, Washington Post, Wall Street Journal, Foreign Affairs, but also the media for the non-academic majority, such as USA Today, the major TV stations, and the new social media, which exploit anti-democratic potential even more directly and uncontrollably as a business model.

At the same time, the oligarchs also finance private elite universities and run their own private foundations, both nationally and internationally. They also apply to the thousands of so-called non-governmental organizations (NGOs), which are in reality capital-financed organizations (CFOs).

6) De-industrialization also threatens national security

This is how the oligarchs have impoverished the US economy. Millions of families are homeless; the pipes, sewage treatment plants, school buildings, and roads are broken.

This has led to a long-term decline in industrial and technological expertise. There is a shortage of skilled workers, engineers, craftsmen, architects, and domestic supply chains. For example, due to the almost complete outsourcing of shipbuilding, it currently takes twelve years to build a state-of-the-art submarine for the US Army, while in China it takes only one year. The USA is now also lagging behind in energy innovation, particularly in constructing the new generation of nuclear power plants (Lloyd 2025). According to Foreign Affairs, this profitable de-industrialization threatens not only the economy but also “national security” (Deese 2025).

In any case, capitalism no longer works according to the prevailing doctrine of the free market economy. Leading domestic and foreign corporations are now only setting up factories in the USA if the state pays historically high subsidies.

The accelerated growth of government debt is further fueled by lower taxes on large corporations, even to the point of zero taxation with the help of professional assistance in tax evasion for the benefit of the super-rich capitalists, who make up 0.001 percent of the population (Rügemer 2025).

3. Capitalist democracy—rotting from within

In Western capitalist democracy, democracy is subordinate to capital in many ways. For example, US capitalists finance also the two political parties they have chosen. However, because the ruling party loses support after two terms at the latest due to its pro-capital policies, capitalists always finance the other (as yet) non-ruling party at the same time.

1) Capitalist one-party system: populist attrition

This endless repetition of populist demagoguery and subsequent disappointment for the vast majority of people is causing democracy to rot. This is how the Democratic Par-

ty has made the Silicon Valley and BlackRock capitalists rich and the majority of people poor. That is why, with Trump, demagoguery is also gaining ground among the white working and middle classes—and why the Silicon Valley corporations and BlackRock & Co. finally have defected to Trump. His 2025 “Big Beautiful Bill”, through further tax breaks and social spending cuts, merely continues the policies initiated by previous Democratic administrations.

So in reality, both parties form a capital one-party system. Its two parties jointly fight and destroy any new parties that even show the slightest signs of emerging, not only anti-capitalist parties, but also social democratic, environmental, and consumer parties.

In any case, only about half of Americans of voting age actually go to the polls, and the millions of illegal workers and their families are not allowed to vote anyway. In completely impoverished neighborhoods, voter turnout is close to zero.

2) And both capital parties under Zionist influence

At the same time, the two capital parties are financed and directed by two other billion-dollar capital lobby organizations, both in the same direction: the Zionist AIPAC finances the Democratic Party, while the equally Zionist Republican Jewish Coalition finances the Republican Party.

This further consolidates the one-party system. For both parties agree on the goal of the occupation, expulsion, and now genocide of the Palestinians in violation of international law, and furthermore on the transformation of the Middle East, Palestine, Lebanon, and Syria, including Iran, led by the proxy warrior Israel.

3) Destruction of human commonalities

In this way, the one-party system, with its service providers, destroys democratic collectivists such as trade unions, environmental and justice initiatives – or seeks out those that are suitable and buys them, finances them, instrumentalists them and perverts them: NGOs become CFOs. This is what happened to the women’s movement, for example: What remained was the promotion of the individual advancement of women to leadership positions in companies, banks, mainstream media, and politics – while the majority of women in work and retirement are becoming even poorer than before.

This is how the Democratic-aligned capital faction has framed its “new values”: it promotes a self-centered notion of self-determination, frequently centered on sexual expression. This is how diversity and LGBTQ+ are promoted, i.e., a small new minority, while at the same time the global army of millions of profitably exploited people, especially women, are humiliated and made invisible.

And it is precisely because of this demagoguery of “new values” that the Republican Trump with his Oligarchs of the second class was able to reach a section of the humiliated in the USA with his new value of “America First” and his demagogue, including the impoverished white working class – but making broken America even worse.

4) The State promotes unearned and even criminal capital gains

The majority of oligarchic wealth that has been increased without performance is promoted by the State through the non-regulation of old and new monopolies and through the non-compliance with laws that are already capital-friendly, for example in the areas

of taxation, insider trading, corruption, and the environment.

This has made the US number one on the World Secrecy Index, meaning it's the world leader in secrecy and not taxing large private fortunes.⁵ The tiny US state of Delaware has become by far the largest financial haven in Western capitalism, with more shell companies for anonymous super-rich people than its nearly one million residents. "The USA is the preferred destination for money that needs to be hidden" (Harrington 2024, 5).

So the three leading rating agencies, Standard & Poor, Moody, and Fitch, contributed to the 2008 financial crisis through profitable complacency ratings – and were not punished, with the approval of the US Congress (Rügemer 2012, 107). The judiciary treats also the big auditing firms such as PWC and E&Y in a similar way. They audit the legality of accounting practices, as required by law. But even they certified the balance sheets of fraudulent, already insolvent banks as proper before the financial crisis, with high profits for themselves – and they too remain unpunished, and so it has continued ever since, from one inconsequential "scandal" to the next.

The mass dissemination of hatred, racism, pornography, and the like, even to children, by social media corporations—highly profitable, but remain also unpunished. Leading white-collar criminals, right up to the US president, go unpunished, while the USA also leads the world in the police and judicial prosecution of petty criminals and the proportion of prisoners.

5) Open and secret luxury excesses of the oligarchs: both factions

The oligarchs live in secluded luxury residences with private jets, private security and other armies of servants, switching between residences in the USA and on islands they have purchased, when they are not residing on their multi-storey luxury yachts, which are equipped as floating high-tech command centers and served by liveried crews, protected by specialized escort ships and helicopters.

While this is purely external and, in principle, public knowledge and is accompanied by sympathetic to semi-critical coverage in the mainstream and mass media, internal behavior rarely comes to light. For example, billionaire Jeffrey Epstein, who made his fortune as an arms dealer in the Middle East, increasingly held important meetings at his second residence on a Caribbean island.

Sexual services were part of the offering, which was, however, much broader. As a member of the Trilateral Commission and the Council on Foreign Relations, it was obvious that not only the current US president attended Epstein's events, but also former US presidents, the head of Israeli government, the head of Microsoft, the leading royals from Great Britain and the Gulf states, and representatives of the respective secret services. The sexual services were scandalized, and Epstein was convicted, but then Epstein in 2019 was found dead in prison.⁶

The oligarchs are having additional luxury bunkers built underground for their existing luxury residences, in view of the dangerous endgame they are promoting. Robots are provided as servants. This profitable business is operating in 50 US cities, but also in

friendly countries.⁷

4. US working class: deaths of despair

That is why the USA also leads the capitalist world in mass poverty and untreated diseases, mafia-style drug trafficking, addiction linked to drug and alcohol abuse, obesity due to poor nutrition, early child mortality, illiteracy, incarceration rates, homelessness, police violence against the underclass, and unpayable private debt.

The US healthcare system is the most expensive in the world, with extremely high profits for pharmaceutical companies and private clinics and high incomes for the very few doctors relative to the population – and the highest co-payments even for normally insured medical treatment, coupled with a high number of people who cannot afford the co-payments or have to go into debt, or cannot afford insurance at all. As a result, millions of people with serious illnesses do not receive treatment. At the same time, untested painkillers such as opioids are advertised, but the overuse causes even more pain, weakens the body, and leads to despair.

1) Epidemic of death, deaths of despair

Partly because mass poverty is confronted with the publicly displayed wealth of oligarchs, it is not medically induced epidemics that are the most important, but rather the “epidemic of death,” i.e., the lonely and hopeless act of letting oneself die, the desire to die, even to the point of active self-destruction. This is the conclusion reached by US Nobel Prize winner for economics, Angus Deaton (Case and Deaton 2020, 194).

As a result, life expectancy among the working class and middle class has been falling since the late 1990s, while the super-rich are living longer and longer and funding research into how they can extend their healthy lives to at least 120 years and leave the broken Earth for other planets.

One form of self-destruction is suicide: the number of privately owned firearms in the USA is far higher than the number of inhabitants. The most common cause of death involving privately owned firearms is suicide: the death of the poor out of desperation, even among children and young people.

2) The US leads the way in private mass executions: amok killings

Because the collective organizations that addressed the existential issues of the working class and also the middle class have been destroyed, people are left speechless and alone to deal with everything themselves. That is why the sham solution eventually bursts out, suddenly, seemingly without any history, without warning.

That is why suicide is often preceded by the murder of those closest to the perpetrator, whether they are spouses, children, siblings, or fellow gang members. The extreme form of this is the recurring mass shootings in the USA— standardized rampages in which the perpetrator targets and kills as many people as possible outside of their own family.

From 2020 to 2023, mostly young people in the USA carried out over 600 mass shootings per year, i.e. two per day, although this definition only included amoks in which at

least four people were killed, excluding the shooter. School amoks in particular have become an epidemic. Gun violence is currently “the leading cause of death for Americans between the ages of one and 17”, and the USA leads the world in this regard (Ware 2025).

5. Broken America—broken US allies

This type of oligarchic rule, accompanied by internal decay and a “broken” society, has also been spreading for about two decades in countries that are systemically linked to the USA, such as Israel and Ukraine – and in the European Union, in Eastern Europe and, with a certain delay, also in the richer states of Western Europe.

1) EU eastward expansion under NATO leadership

Thus, after World War II, it was not only the establishment of the European Union that was led by the US, both economically and militarily. This continued after 1990 with the “eastward expansion” of the EU, which was again dominated by NATO.

The right-wing, anti-communist, and anti-Russian media, parties, and CFOs were promoted, leading to economic impoverishment with low wages that violate human rights, state subsidies for supplier companies, and millions of people migrating for work—all to the benefit of rising national oligarch clans and western corporations (Rügemer 2022).

2) US investors are buying companies in the EU

This also applies in a different form to the rich Western European founding states of the EU.

Already after World War I, and even more so after World War II, US corporations and banks operated thousands of branches here. But since the turn of the millennium, new US capital upstarts such as BlackRock, Vanguard, State Street, and private equity investors such as Blackstone, KKR, and Carlyle have become majority shareholders, owners, and reshapes of capitalism in Germany, France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxembourg, Spain, Italy, and Switzerland, and have been doing so in the UK for even longer. They have brought with them their “civilian private army” of consultants and agencies, which advise not only investors but also governments and the European Commission.

US investors receiving even more government subsidies and pay almost no taxes, the vassal European oligarchs are getting also a little bit richer, the states are getting even more into debt and thereby violate the European’s debt rules – and workers, employees, pensioners and the majority of the middle class getting poorer.

As a consequence, the one-party system in the USA is profoundly impacting the EU. Here, too, support for the long-ruling, pro-capitalist parties is dwindling. Meanwhile, their remnants are consolidating into a more unified bloc, shifting even farther toward the populist right and becoming more overtly pro-capitalist. As in the US, this includes more and more also Zionism.

3) US gun violence penetrating Europe

Thus, the phenomena of internal decay are spreading in US-allied states: political right-wing development, despair, and declining life expectancy for the majority. Often directly inspired by US amoks that receive extensive media coverage, but above all because the social and class conditions for them also exist in the EU, amoks are on the rise

in two dozen US-friendly states, such as Norway, Sweden, France, Austria, and Germany. This is a “particularly bloody form of international US influence” – and the US elites are well aware of this (Ware 2025).

Social media platforms from the USA – not only in the vicinity of the current president Donald Trump – contribute to this export “by glorifying violence, especially among disillusioned young men.” Attempts at regulation, such as the EU’s Digital Services Act, are completely ineffective.

4) Private gun violence – the flip side of global military violence

The US global leadership in domestic gun violence – which is also linked to international and illegal exports – is the systemic flip side of US global leadership in military presence, wars and military operations, the operation of military bases and the promotion of proxy terrorists.

Contrary to what is propagated, both unregulated forms of violence do not serve peace and security, but death and even greater insecurity – and the excessive private profits of a tiny minority.

6. The dangerous endgame of US-led capitalism

The “strange triumph of broken America” with its oligarchic rule and internal rot is to continue, according to the US capital elite, albeit with a few corrections.

The renewed hubris of the USA began with the collapse of the Soviet Union and the socialist states of Eastern Europe. The US therefore waged a new series of wars, proxy wars, and preparation for wars in the 1990s—Serbia/Kosovo, Palestine, Sudan, Iraq, Afghanistan, Venezuela, Yemen, Ukraine, Libya.

In continuation and intensification, the Obama presidency saw the start of increased armament of European NATO members, the eastward and northward expansion of NATO, the establishment of additional military presence in Africa and especially in Asia and, above all, the declaration of the People’s Republic of China as the new enemy of the system.⁸

1) Why the US is preparing for a possible World War

There are two reasons why after 1945 the US oligarchs now are preparing again for a possible new world war and a new wave of a more aggressive capitalist globalization:

1. De-industrialization, impoverishment, and self-destruction of its own population, decay of infrastructure, loss of innovative strength, including in the field of technology, decline of long-standing ruling parties, values, and media, and, associated with this, the loss of the youth’s willingness to fight, and finally, the loss of international standing – this applies, with differences, also to the other states of the US-led capitalism.

2. The US oligarchs and their vassals would accept this if there were no systemically logical, globally effective alternative: the rapid rise of the People’s Republic of China to become the largest industrial and trading nation in terms of purchasing power, combined with successful global cooperation.

2) Both capital factions now behind Trump

That is why the younger multi-billionaire capital faction, which is still hardly present globally in terms of investment, has organized itself, politically embodied in the current US President Trump. These second-tier oligarch clans are even more aggressive and openly right-wing extremist. They are now also looking for global investments and cooperation partners – but in the meantime, the oligarchs of Silicon Valley and Black-Rock & Co., who owe their profits to the Democratic Party, are defecting to Trump's Republican Party.

Here are the most important measures:

- Abolition of the already weak US regulations and closure or weakening of US regulatory agencies (environment, labor, finance, media) and establishment of a new, loyalist deep state
- Even more minority operations outside and against the United Nations
- Global trade wars with high tariffs, even against “allies” and “best friends”
- Intensifying the highly subsidized re-industrialization of the USA combined with Artificial Intelligence
- Accelerated rearmament against the main systematic enemy, China
- Accelerated rearmament of European NATO members as proxy warriors against Russia, now that Ukraine has been bled dry and can no longer procure new soldiers
- Search for relations with openly far-right and/or weak small governments worldwide like Zionist super capitalist Miler in Argentine and increased search for new proxy warriors
- Investments within the gaps of the current globalization structure, particularly in the Middle East, in Greater Israel which includes Palestine, Lebanon, Syria, southern Cyprus and some Gulf States.

3) Strategy with new conflicts, nationally and globally

This strategy produces new conflicts. So these measures could only slowly take effect. Additionally the extremely short term profit practices of the rapidly rising capital faction around Trump himself are jeopardizing the US national security, as many authors in Foreign Affairs are analyzing.

Even though the big Silicon Valley globalists and their major shareholders like Black-Rock have politically defected to Trump, they are by no means fulfilling his wishes. Apple, for example, is not relocating the production of its iPhones and other devices to the USA, but increasingly shifting production from China to India.

Above all the resistance within the vassal and friendly states is encountering in many ways, especially within the Arab states, also by new alliances, for example between Canada and Mexico.

So the danger of small and separate and large-scale wars led by the USA is growing in the foreseeable future.

4) Zionism triumphs over Christianity

Christian protestant churches, including evangelical end-time Christians, traditionally are among the ideological pillars of US capitalism. Trump has drawn also additional Christian fundamentalist sects, including from the Catholic side. Also “Christian Zionists” have joined his ranks.

But Christianity no longer attracts the masses in the USA. Professing Christians have become a minority in recent decades. That is why with Trump, it is the most extreme variant of final victory Zionism which emerged openly as the leading religious ideology of the traditional God-contentedness of the US state. So the richest Zionist foundation, the Abelson Foundation, since the 1990s is the largest financier of both the current US president Trump, and the longtime head of the Israeli government, Benjamin Netanyahu.⁹ So Trump repeats: “God bless America” and “God bless Israel”.

So the Zionist “holy war” and the endgame that is already being waged by Israel against the Palestinians is being expanded and prepared globally in the long term by the US against “the left, Islam, and China” (Hegseth 2020) to save “broken America”—just as Israel’s decades-long occupation policy has already been a highly profitable business model for US and Israeli armament and surveillance corporations and continues to be as genocide.¹⁰

According to Trump, a preliminary step would be to transform the ethnically cleansed Gaza into the “Riviera of the Middle East”.

Also in the European capitalist democracies, the traditional influence of the two major Christian churches has declined massively, and there are only very few parties left that still call themselves Christian, and these have been shrinking since decades, as in Germany. Also now among these declining servants of capitalists in Europe, the Zionist Old Testament is now triumphing over the Christian New Testament for the first time in public. This also applies to the two major Christian churches: They do not protest against the Zionist genocide in Palestine. The Catholic Vatican with its new Pope Leo XIV from the USA does not even protest when Israel destroys Catholic communities in Palestine, Lebanon and Syria.

At the same time, this ideological narrowing is leading to further global isolation of the US oligarchs and their vassals. As a result, the USA more and more stands alone with Israel, for example in more and more UN votes, isolated from the vast majority of mankind.

7. The multi-polar self-organization of humanity

After World War II, the UN was the essential step in this direction with international law and human rights, which since then have also included labor and social rights. This was a result of the victory over fascism in Europe, Japan and China, combined with the

enormous upswing in anti-colonial struggles and successes. This was also expressed in the G77 movement.

This has been undermined above all by the USA with its claim to be the sole world hegemonic power and with the help of vassals and proxy warriors, militarily, economically, politically, through secret services, ideologically and culturally, also by many dozens of wars and regime changes and the installation of dictatorships. However, the democratic counter-movement has been gaining momentum from many sources for two decades.

1) National sovereignty: People's Republic of China

The People's Republic of China has increasingly successfully freed itself from this US-led globalization, and gained national sovereignty. In doing so, China has also proven that capitalist practices can be regulated and transformed for the benefit of the working majority of the population.

Sustainable wage increases for hundreds of millions of workers, the expansion of modern infrastructure, environmentally friendly energy production, cutting-edge technological innovations, capital-independent politics and science – all this has become possible. China leads the way in renewable energies and reforestation. Fraudulent managers are punished, and foreign digital corporations that engage in espionage are banned. Insolvent companies are not necessarily bailed out by the state.

Foreign companies are also subject to regulations that they do not accept in the US and the EU, but in China they accept these regulations. The sovereign nation of China also established national supply chains – in contrast to US-led Neo-colonial capitalism.

2) Inclusive, cooperative globalization

These principles also apply logically to the international cooperation in which China participates, providing economic support and helping to develop the economic and political power of the participating countries.

Although the USA co-founded the UN, it has, from the outset, increasingly acted without and against the UN, both economically and militarily, in accordance with its self-defined formula of a “rules-based international order” which, since the founding of the state, with reference to “God”, is to be led toward a religiously supported final victory. So individual UN sub-organizations are either boycotted (human rights commission), ignored (ILO), or corrupted and then left (WHO). This applies also for example to international institutions like the WTO, the withdrawal from the nuclear agreement with Iran, and from the Paris Climate Agreement.

For this reason, the new international and continental formats of the multipolar world order—BRICS, SCO, CELAC, FOCAC, EEF, etc.—are based on the UN Charter, but at the same time are developing their own new cooperative structures. The religious endgame of US-led capitalism, intensified by the current US administration under president Trump is accelerating new cooperation between damaged states and states which follow international rights and human rights. This applies, for example, to the Hague Group, which, under the leadership of Colombia and South Africa, developed a plan in Bogota with 30 states to end Israel's genocide: “The Era of Impunity is Over.”¹¹

In addition to state relations, multi-polar cooperation within civil society must also be strengthened, for example between companies, trade unions, anti-capitalist parties and movements, cooperatives, initiatives for peace, for human rights work and pensions, for human rights housing, for human rights healthcare and education, for public transport, for women's forums, for ecological agriculture, for capital-independent sciences, arts, sports and media, for old and new sociable groups of all ages – and this also in strengthened, renewed international cooperation, even and especially when governments have not (yet) broken away from US-led broken capitalism!
